Shotgun Gang Leader Jailed

Parolee Is Unable To Explain \$1,700 Cash

DETROIT — James Tamer, leader of a shotgun gang which robbed a Flint bank of \$55,000 in 1934, was sent back to Southern Michigan Prison today after police picked him up last night in a routine checkup.

Tamer and three other bandits robbed the Citizens Commercial and Savings Bank in Flint. He was arrested five years later when his car was involved in an accident near Miami, Florida.

He was given a 15-year jail sentence in 1939, but was paroled February 26, 1944.

Police nabbed him Friday night in a checkup on a bar in downtown Detroit. They said he was carrying \$1,700 cash and that he was in company with "five petty hoodlums."

Authorities reported Tamer's upholstery business in Detroit was declared bankrupt last month and they queried him about the source of the \$1,700.

Dissatisfied with his replies, police took him back to prison to complete his original sentence.

'Perch Derby' To Help Feed Needy Britons

GODERICH—A perch derby will be one of numerous stunts to be staged by the Goderich Lions Club to raise funds in their "Food for Britain" campaign.

Bill MacDonald will be in charge of this division and will announce dates later. Sportsmen entering the event will be charged an entry fee. First, second and third prizes will be given for the largest perch caught.

The perch derby will be but one of several schemes to be employed by Group Number One, of which Norman Miller is chairman, to raise its quota.

Three other groups have yet to decide fund-raising plans. A total objective of \$2,000 has been set.

Typhus Epidemic Rages in Romania

PARIS—A United Nations spokesman estimated today there are 40,000 cases of typhus in Romania.

The spokesman, representing the U. N. International Children's Emergency Fund, said there were 25,000 typhus cases in Romania at the end of December. He added that an average of 2,500 new cases were breaking out weekly.

The informant said 20,000 kilograms of DDT (about 44,000 pounds) had been shipped from Prague to help wipe out disease-bearing insects.

Romania had asked the U. N. agency for help in fighting the epidemic.

Public Unaware of Limits Placed on Women Jurors

Should a woman be as eligible as a man to serve on juries?

The first thing you run up against when you start measuring public attitudes on this question is that only about a third of the general public knows that there are legal obstacles to women serving on juries.

The issue came to the fore recently in a Hamilton, Ont., case, in which a woman, elected jury foreman, was afterwards found to have been ineligible even for jury duty—because she was a woman.

While the law varies somewhat in different provinces, a Canadian Press survey concluded that, in all provinces (with the exception of Prince Edward Island) women do not have as free a right to do jury duty as men. It is assumed they do have in Prince Edward Island, because the act reads: "Jury shall consist of 12 reasonable persons."

That the Canadian public is not aware of this situation is shown by results of a national Gallup Poll, in which the first question asked was:

"Do you know whether or not it is legal for a woman to serve on any jury in Canada?" Here were the answers:

The only differences between the factual knowledge of men and women on this issue was that, while 32 percent of the men voluntarily admitted they didn't know the answer, 40 percent of women admitted they didn't know.

It is clear from the survey that as far as the general public is concerned, weight of opinion favors admission of women to juries.

Both the group who thought women were eligible to all jury duty, and those who thought they were not eligible, were asked:

"Do you approve or disapprove of this?"

Those Canadians who thought women were eligible showed an overwhelming majority in favor of their "eligibility."

Those who, more correctly, knew that women were not eligible in most types of jury duty, showed an overall majority disapproving their ineligibility:

In Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, women are barred from all jury service, according to a Canadian

Press survey. In British Columbia, a woman may sit on all juries, except a coroner's jury. Alberta women are admitted on civil juries, but not on capital cases, where the juries are locked up. Saskatchewan is reported to be considering allowing women to sit on juries if they voluntarily agree to do so.

Reuther Will Take Stand

DETROIT—C. I. O. United Auto Workers' President Walter P. Reuther will be called by General Motors to testify Monday when the National Labor Relations Board resumes its hearing on "unfair" labor charges against the corporation.

G. M. Counsel Harry S. Benjamin said he also intended to subpoena T. A. Johnstone, Reuther's assistant in the U. A. W.'s General Motors department.

Both appeared earlier as government witnesses on a U. A. W. complaint that G. M. refused to bargain collectively on a group insurance plan.

Benjamin indicated the corporation would finish its case by Monday afternoon, opening the way for rebuttal witnesses to appear.

Informally, attorneys have agreed to waive oral arguments and end their phase of the case by filing briefs with Trial Examiner James J. Fitzpatrick, who will draw up his report for the N. L. R. B. at Washington.

Two Flint Men And Plane Missing

EAST LANSING, Mich.—A search was resumed today for two Flint men missing since Thursday when they took off in a small plane to fly from Houghton Lake to Flint.

Six planes from Selfridge Field and a state police craft, together with 27 civilian pilots, began hunting yesterday for Dr. C. W. Murray, a Flint dentist, and his pilot, Ivan E. Martin.

Darkness halted the exhaustive search concentrated in the Bay City area, but the military and civilian planes took up the hunt again today.

Martin, co-owner of Flint Flying Service based at Bishop Airport, was reported to have had only enough fuel for three hours of flying when he took off near Dr. Murray's cabin Thursday morning.

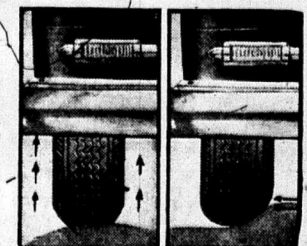
