

welcome

to *The Comedy of Errors*, our closing show of the 40th anniversary season. I'd also like to welcome our artists from Montreal (along with Ottawa's own Paul Rainville) and our producing partner The Centaur Theatre Company. In the past, productions with the Centaur

have been contemporary works by Montreal playwrights like David Fennario and Michel Tremblay, so it is both surprising and a delight to co-produce with this theatre on a work by William Shakespeare! While the language might be a little different, the spirit of this production was inspired by the wonderful city and stories of Montreal. Here is a classical play with a unique modern twist.

The Comedy of Errors was for many years understood as an early farce of Shakespeare's, based on a Roman comedy by Plautus. While entertaining, it was considered to be a slight work, heavy on form and light on content. However, the last twenty years has seen a revived interest in the play -- for containing within it many of the seeds of Shakespeare's great lyrical romance comedies. Perhaps there is more to it than meets the eye. The presence of twins is quintessentially "Shakespearean", providing ample opportunity for comic invention, but also for an examination of identity and the divided nature of experience. Antipholus of Syracuse enters the play in quest of his lost brother and mother, and therein lies a metaphysical journey too. "I to the world am like a drop of water, that in the ocean seeks another drop, who, falling there to find his fellow forth, unseen, inquisitive, confounds himself." This observation casts a reflective light upon the play and allows the dual nature of its comedy to generate not only laughter but pathos and insight.

Shakespeare himself was a father of twins, and the predominance of the theme in this play explores the idea with a real sense of authenticity. Every character in the play is given an emotional flip side, a thematic "twin" that demands reconciliation with an equal and yet opposing nature. Time is divided in the contrast of day to night, people and trades are divided, (a courtesan and an abbess live almost side by side) and ultimately all of the characters are divided by an edict which governs the play in the "mortal and intestine jars" between the people of Syracuse and Ephesus. The play opens with a Syracusian merchant given 12 hours to raise funds to forestall his execution, and in this we are given the dual and profound struggle between life and death. The contrasting nature of Syracuse and Ephesus in The Comedy of Errors has always reminded me of Canada's dual comparison: the fixation with contrasting Toronto and Montreal. Given that recognition is such key element to comedy, I thought it the perfect inspiration for this production.

Comedies are wise things because they show us who we are through laughter. We have laughed a lot in rehearsal for this production and also been struck with so many of the ideas in the play — and that is an amazing thing, when you contrast a play written over four hundred years ago with our current time.

For the NAC: Andreas is thrilled to be making his NAC debut as a professional actor, having last performed on this stage at the tender age of 16 in a children's theatre production.

Theatre: In between these NAC appearances Andreas has been involved in many Theatre, Film and Television projects. Most notably: A Doll House directed

CLARE COULTER The Abbess at Ephesus

For the NAC: Ms Coulter first performed at the NAC in Timothy Findley's Can You See Me Yet, followed by The Effect of Gamma Rays on Man In the Moon Marigolds. Last year she played Halle in Peter Hinton's production of Buried Child.

Theatre: Clare Coulter is known nationally for performances throughout the is country. She is the daughter of Irish/Canadian playwright John Coulter whose play *Riel* was produced by the National Arts Centre in January 1975, starring Albert Millaire. Recently Ms Coulter performed with the National Theatre School in *When We Dead Awaken* and *Far Away* directed by Philip McKee. Collaborating with Philip McKee, Kate Whitehead, and Pierre Luc Brunet, she adapted *The Human Voice* for Zoofest, Just For Laughs, Montreal.



DANIELLE DESORMEAUX Dromio of Syracuse

For the NAC: Danielle is very pleased to be returning to Ottawa where she began her acting career and especially to the NAC where she appeared in *National Capital/e Nationale* as well as on numerous occasions with the NACO. Theatre: She has performed with many other orchestras across Canada, the U.S. and South East Asia with internationally acclaimed Platypus Theatre.

BRAULIO ELICER Angelo, a goldsmith; Officer of the Law

For the NAC: This is Braulio's NAC debut.

Theatre: Braulio graduated from Dawson's Professional Theatre Program in 2007 where he performed, among others, the roles of Oliver in *As You Like It*, Father Bojovic in *Pentecost*, and Valentine in *Orpheus Descending*. He then cofounded QuintProductions and co-created *This Hour Has 88 Years* for the

Montreal Fringe Festival (Centaur Theatre honourable mention and 2008 Mecca nomination for Best Ensemble). Other roles include Juan in the world premiere of Les Z'enfants de Choeur (Montreal's Bilingual production of Altar Boyz), Macduff in Macbeth and Speed in The Two Gentlemen of Verona with the Montreal Shakespeare Theatre company's 2009 tour and Matt_109 in Whisper. The same year, Braulio was named the winner of Montréal's Musical Theatre challenge, Le Spotlight, along with being voted the audience's favourite performer. He is extremely honoured and excited to be on the NAC stage.



MARCEL JEANNIN Antipholus of Syracuse

For the NAC: The Bookshop (a co-production with Théâtre du Gros Mécano). Theatre: Marcel has performed in various theatres across Canada, notably the Centaur Theatre, the Great Canadian Theatre Company, the Stratford Shakespeare Festival, The Segal Centre, Theatre Columbus and the Globe Theatre in Regina. Other: His television credits include Dead Zone, Snakes and Ladders and The Sign

of Four. Film credits include 300, Taking Lives, Wicker Park, The Sum of all Fears and Affliction. He lends his voice to numerous cartoons, including Arthur, Lucky Luke and Postcards from Buster. For the NAC: This is Debra's NAC debut.

For the NAC: This is Stephen's NAC debut.

Theatre: A graduate of the National Theatre School of Canada (acting 1988), Stephen has worked as a performer, director, writer and producer internationally. Since 2002, he has been collaborating with artist Aaron Pollard on 2boys.tv, creating and touring transmedia performances, installations and

videos throughout Canada, the U.S.A., South America and Europe.

Other: Stephen has worked many times for CBC radio as a writer, director, performer and columnist. He is the 2009 recipient of the Canada Council for the Arts Victor Martyn Lynch Staunton award, recognizing outstanding mid-career achievements in the field of Integrated arts.



DANETTE MACKAY Adriana, wife to Antipholus of Ephesus

For the NAC: This is Danette's NAC debut.

Theatre: Danette is a Toronto-born, southern Ontario-raised Franco-Ontarienne who was adopted by Montreal at seventeen, where she has lived and worked ever since. Last season she had the opportunity of playing Ricotta in the premiere production of Bryden MacDonald's *With Bated Breath*, at the

Centaur Theatre. Other Centaur theatre credits include *Urban Tales*, which was co-produced by the Centaur and Theatre Urbi & Orbi, and *Dinner with Friends*, directed by Rosemary Dunsmore. Other recent theatre roles include Monique in the premiere English production of Jean Marc Dalpé's *August*, for the ATP in Calgary, and Joanne in *2,3* by Harry Standjofski for the Nouveau Théâtre Anglais. ALBERT MILLAIRE C.C., C.Q. Aegeon, a merchant of Syracuse

For the NAC: Riel. In 2003, Albert Millaire was Honorary Chair of the NAC Theatre Renewal Campaign.

Theatre: Actor, director, and narrator of international repute, Albert Millaire returned to the Centaur stage having last appeared there in the 2005 production of Long Day's Journey Into Night. Celebrating a professional theatre

career for more than 50 years, Millaire has directed numerous French-Canadian works, notably the Théâtre du Nouveau Monde production of Roch Carrier's *La Guerre, Yes Sir*, which he toured in Europe and presented in English at the Stratford Festival in the summer of 1972; the 1990 production of John Murrell's *Memoir* at the Stratford Shakespeare Festival; and Rossini's *Le Compte Ory* for Opéra de Montréal. In 1991 he was at Stratford, joining the acting company as the Player King in *Hamlet*, Malvolio in *Twelfth Night* and Chrysalde in *The School of Wives* by Molière. Albert Millaire has been Associate Artistic Director of Théâtre du Nouveau Monde and Artistic Director of Théâtre Repentigny, Théâtre Populaire du Québec and Théâtre du Bois de Boulognes. Other: As an actor, he has performed as James in *Passion Play* (SBC), in *The Misanthrope* by Molière (TPQ) and the role of Salieri in *Amadeus* (TNM), to name a few. Other credits include more than forty Radio Canada productions and six feature films for the NFB and private companies. He is a Companion of the Order of Canada, and a Chevalier of the Order of Québec.



LENI PARKER Luciana, sister of Adriana

For the NAC: Leni is thrilled to be performing in *The Comedy of Errors* here at the NAC. She was a participant in *The Ark* in 2008, studying the works of Brecht under the direction of Peter Hinton.

Theatre: Recent theatre credits in Montreal include: A Christmas Carol for Geordie Productions; Inherit The Wind for The Segal Centre; The Salon

Automaton for Buddies in Bad Times, where she played the voice of The Patroness robot; the world premiere of Colleen Wagner's Down From Heaven for Imago Theatre; Age of Arousal for Centaur Theatre; Life is a Dream for Scapegoat Carnivale; The Baroness and The Pig for Imago Theatre, which was awarded Best English Language Production from the French Critics Circle, and Best Production from the 2008 MECCAS; Isadora:Fabulist for Imago Theatre; she played Albertine in Assorted Candies for Centaur Theatre, for which she was awarded a Best Actress MECCA, and was nominated for a best supporting actress Masques for 2007. Leni was a member of Pigeons International Theatre company for 10 years (1987–1997), a theatre/dance company which toured Canada and Europe with their original collective pieces. She also worked with the French company, Théâtre Momentum, in La Fête des Morts. Leni will be performing in the English language premiere of Pierre-Michel Tremblay's Au Champ De Mars under the direction of Micheline Chevrier, produced by Imago Theatre.

Leni would like to thank Peter Hinton for illuminating Shakespeare's world and words for her. And a huge Thank You to the NAC for their work on this show.



PAUL RAINVILLE Solinus, the Duke of Ephesus; Dr. Pinch, a psychic investigator

For the NAC: Happy Days, Hamlet, The "Vaudevilles" of Chekov, The Winter's Tale Theatre: Ottawa is home but the work has taken Paul across the country. Last year in Wajdi Mouwad Scorched, Paul got to step into the shoes of Notary Alphonse Lebel in Winnipeg and then Edmonton. Springtime in the Rocky

Mountains for the Banff Centre's Playwrights' Colony and a summer at the Prince Edward County Festival left him well traveled, full of country comforts and the pleasure of play in good work with great artists. Last fall was all about home in a co-production at Ottawa's Great Canadian Theatre Company with the Ottawa School of Speech and Drama. The show involved six young Ottawa actors and four local adult actors in the premiere of Ottawa native Hannah Moscovitch's *The Children's Republic*. Paul got to portray Janusz Korczak. A renowned advocate for children's rights, Korczak's work was used as the basis for the United Nations document that established an international framework for those rights. Korczak perished with his orphans at Treblinka in 1942. Sometimes we get to fill big shoes.

the creative team



PETER HINTON Director

For the NAC: Peter has been the Artistic Director of English Theatre at Canada's National Arts Centre since 2005. For the NAC he has directed Allen Cole's *The Wrong Son*, Gloria Montero's *Frida K.*, Marie Clements' *Copper Thunderbird*, Shakespeare's *Macbeth*, William Congreve's *The Way of the World*, Sam Shepard's *Buried Child*, Selma Lagerlöf's *The Changeling* translated by Sylvia Söderlind, and most recently, Bertolt Brecht's *Mother*

Courage and her Children and Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol starring the 40th Anniversary English Theatre Acting Company. In 2008, he was awarded the Audrey Ashley Award for outstanding contribution to Ottawa theatre by the Capital Critics Circle. In September 2007, Mr. Hinton welcomed to the NAC Britain's Royal Shakespeare Company, with whom the NAC English Theatre partnered to produce the world premiere of Margaret Atwood's stage adaptation of her novel, *The Penelopiad*. This collaboration marked the first partnership between the Royal Shakespeare Company and a Canadian theatre company.

Theatre: Before coming to the National Arts Centre, Peter was an associate artist at The Stratford Shakespeare Festival for seven seasons, directing *The Taming of the Shrew*, Shakespeare's Universe, *The Odyssey*, *Fanny Kemble*, *The Duchess of Malfi, Into the Woods*, and all three parts of his own verse trilogy entitled *The Swanne*. Peter was the Dramaturg in Residence at Playwrights Workshop Montreal for five years and has been Associate Artistic Director at both The Canadian Stage Company and Theatre Passe Muraille in Toronto. On December 30, 2009, Peter Hinton was named an Officer of the Order of Canada.



EO SHARP Set & Costume Designer

For the NAC: The Comedy of Errors is Eo Sharp's seventh set and costume design for the National Arts Centre. In the previous two seasons, Eo has designed sets and costumes for A Christmas Carol, Buried Child (coproduction with The Segal Theatre), The Changeling, And All for Love, Falstaff and The Snow Show.

Theatre: Past collaborations with Peter Hinton include set designs for *The Swanne: Parts II and III* (The Stratford Festival), *A Doll's House* (Lenore and Alvin Segal Theatre), *Snowman* (Imago Theatre) as well as *girls! girls! girls!* (Teatro Comenici/Festival Theatre des Ameriques). Originally from Toronto, Eo now lives in Montreal. She has a B.F.A. from the University of Toronto and is a graduate of the National Theatre School's design program. In Montreal, Eo has won the Mecca Award for Best Design for both *Looking for Romeo* (Sin 4 Productions) and *Human Collision/Atomic Reaction* (The Other Theatre/Festival Théâtre des Amériques).



ROBERT THOMSON Lighting Designer

For the NAC: Buried Child (co-production with The Leanor and Alvin Segal Theatre), Macbeth and Present Laughter (co-productions with Citadel Theatre), The Unanswered Question, and Sticks and Stones (Stratford Shakespeare Festival production). Theatre: Over the past eight seasons he has designed 24 productions for the Stratford Shakespeare Festival. Many were collaborations with Peter Hinton,

including *The Taming Of The Shrew, The Odyssey, Fanny Kemble, Into the Woods* and all three parts of *The Swanne*. His other recent Stratford designs include *Zastrozzi, Rice Boy, Romeo and Juliet, Caesar and Cleopatra* and *King Lear,* both starring Christopher Plummer. Next season, he is designing *Dangerous Liaisons* on the Festival Stage. Mr. Thomson designed for The Shaw Festival for 24 seasons, with credits including a ten-year term as head of Lighting Design, *St. Joan, Picnic, Cavalcade* and *Cyrano de Bergerac*. Robert also served as resident Lighting Designer for The National Ballet of Canada for 12 seasons and designed over 25 ballets, including *Swan Lake* and *Romeo and Juliet*. His recent credits include the globally acclaimed *Bluebeard's Castle* and *Erwartung* directed by Robert Lepage for Opéra de Québec and Seattle Opera, *Krapp's Last Tape* and *Hughie* starring Brian Dennehy for Chicago's Goodman Theatre, *The Wizard of Oz* for the Citadel Theatre, *Inherit the Wind* for The Segal Theatre and the Tony Award-nominated production of *King Lear* starring Christopher Plummer on Broadway. Robert has received numerous awards over his 30-year career, including a Sterling for Edmonton Opera's mounting of *Bluebeard's Castle* and four Dora Mavor Moore awards.



JEAN-FRANÇOIS GAGNON Fight Director

For the NAC: Has worked with English Theatre, most recently on *Macbeth*, and French Theatre at the NAC.

Theatre: A graduate from the National Theatre School of Canada, where he has been teaching dramatic combat since 1991, Jean-François pursues parallel careers as Actor, Fight Director and Director. He served as a Consultant for

Le Cirque du Soleil/Robert Lepage /MGM project, KÀ. Jean-François has been directing fight scenes on stage and for the screen for twenty years. As such, he has coached many actors and singers, and he is pleased to work again with Peter Hinton. Present productions include As you Like it. La Reine Margot, Red Noses, Celebrating Moliere.

Other: TV/Film credits include Swordmaster on *Triple Sensation, Are You Afraid of the Dark, 41/2* and *The Secret Adventure of Jules Verne* and Stunt Conceptor on *Cabaret Neige Noire*. He is a recognized Fight Master and member of Fight Directors Canada, where he is presently Vice President of Training. He will be teaching at the Annual FDC National Dramatic Combat Workshop happening this summer at Concordia University.



TROY SLOCUM Sound Designer

For the NAC: Mother Courage and her Children (co-production with Manitoba Theatre Centre), A Christmas Carol, Buried Child (co-production with The Segal Theatre), The Way of the World and Frida K, all directed by Peter Hinton. Theatre: A sound designer, studio engineer, and composer, where he works out of a studio called Summit Sounds in the Montreal artists' and musicians'

Mecca that is Mile-End, Troy began designing sound for theatre on *girls! girls! girls!* (Teatro Comaneci) directed by Peter Hinton at the Montreal Fringe Festival in 2000 and a later remount at the Festival de Théâtre des Amériques, and hasn't stopped since. Other Projects include *Snowman*, for which he was nominated for a 2004 Masques Award for sound design (Imago Theatre); *Hunted* (Urban Ink Productions); *An Enemy of The People*, and Peter Hinton's

adaptation of A Doll House (Leanor & Alvin Segal Theatre); The Envelope Plays (Tightrope Theatre); Blacks Don't Bowl, and The Lady Smith, for which he was nominated for a 2006 Montreal English Critics Circle Award Award for Sound Design (Black Theatre Workshop); Alice's Adventures In Wonderland, A Giraffe In Paris, and All The World (Geordie Productions).



STÉFANIE SÉGUIN Stage Manager

For the NAC: Mother Courage and her Children (co-production with Manitoba Theatre Centre), A Christmas Carol, The Changeling, The Snow Show: The Great Frost of 1608, And All For Love, Copper Thunderbird, The Wrong Son, recovery, Crowns (co-production with Manitoba Theatre Centre and CanStage); Vanya (co-production with Citadel Theatre); The "Vaudevilles" of Chekhov, Love's




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
